PRESIDENT'S REPORT - From A.G.M. 25th May, 1982

The Folk Song & Dance Society of Victoria has had a reasonably successful year in 1981-82. We have recovered, somewhat, financially; become incorporated at last; started a Folk Club in a successful venue; and begun presenting a radio programme once every six weeks; as well as continuing the monthly Sunday dances; and making quality International acts available to the Melbourne folk community.

At the start of the year, we were financially unsound, so our thanks must go to "Black Sheep" for playing for the benefit dance which brought us back onto a healthy footing. At about the same time of the year we ran a concert and a dance featuring the "High Level Ranters" from Northumberland. Both these functions were well received and well patronised.

Incorporation of the Society into a Limited Company, which has been on the agenda of successive committee since the early seventies, has finally been achieved. John Byrne did most, if not all, of the hard work on this and his efforts are much appreciated.

Our Folk Club, which started the year (until August, '81) still being run fortnightly at the Common Garden restaurant, was forced to find a new venue. With the new venue came a new name and the Melbourne Folk Club was born at the Exford Hotel. Once we can successfully solve the problem of poor air circulation on hot or crowded nights, we will have a very good club. Almost all the performers I have talked to think it is an excellent place to perform.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Contd.)

In February, we combined with Hocking & Woods to present "The Boys of the Lough" at the Universal Theatre. While the concert itself was very good, the delay instarting was a farce, and future involvement with, or productions at, the Universal Theatre will need to have the details spelled out very plainly. At this stage, I would like to thank the sound engineer for doing the sound checks, on two groups, under very trying circumstances, in what was really a very short time.

Our involvement with the Folk Touring Circuit has lapsed, at the moment, until we can find a way to cover the high costs involved in a National tour by artists not yet well enough known to draw sufficient people through the door.

The Graham Squance Memorial Award, which F.S.D.S.V. presents each year for services to Folk Music, was this year given to Neville Simpson of Upper Nariel, for his work in the Corryong area and Northeastern Victoria. (It was obvious, by the enthusiasm of the crowd present, that the choice was a very popular one. ED.)

The Society has taken over as one of the presenters of the "That's All Folk" programme on 3CR, which goes to air on Monday nights from 9.30-11.00p.m. As there is a roster of six presenters, we do a programme every six weeks. Prior to doing the first programme, we had to learn how to operate all the buttons and switches that are collectively known as a "panel". So far. we have only done two programmes, so we are still learning how to do it properly and smoothly. Once we both feel competent and confident, we hope to actively involve Society members in the presentation of the programme. In the meantime, we would appreciate constructive criticism of, and advice about, the pro-We would also like offeres of the loan gramme and its content. of material, e.g. records, or tapes thereof, if you would rather not trust your records to us - the 3CR library is neither comprehensive nor well-cared for. Our next programme goes to air on 14th June.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone, both committee and members who helped the Society, in any way, this year." J.B. JOHNSTON.



The 16th National Folk Festival held at Sydney University over the Easter weekend was a great success, enjoyed by both audiences and performers alike.

All facets of the Festival turned out well, including the continuous folk club which had different artists on all days from 11am to 6pm, continuous films, and the free daily childrens workshops to keep the kids occupied whilst teaching them something about folk song and dance.

Some of the most popular workshops included "A Music Hall Entertainment" by Phil Baker, "And Jill Came Tumbling After" by Judy Small, and the Bloodwood workshop "Boom, Bust, Banality, Booze and Blacks". Nice to see Peter Parkhill introducing music and songs of other nationalities.

The launching of John Dengate's book "My Shout" was very successful, and it's wonderful to have John's twenty years experiences and works recorded at long last!

All the dance workshops were well attended (and we all learned a few new dance steps), as were the dances - particularly Sunday night at the Town Hall.

The Opera House held two successful concerts, one Thursady night and the other Saturday night. The "horris Ale" was extremely well attended on Saturday night, and we all loved the Wedderburn Old-Timers at Wentworth 4.

All in all, a great Festival, culminating in the Chorus Cup on Monday (we won in spite of competition from G'norm & Company from Melbourne!)

Hope everyone enjoyed it as much as we did. Thanks to the Task Force for the 'behind-the-scenes' work, Glenn & Rob, Len, Mike, Frank, Gary, Bruce, and Julie (for organising the door people) to mention just a few who spring to mind. Thanks to Sydney University for the availability of premises and the catering staff who kept us fed and watered, and once again all the performers too numerous to mention, who helped to make the Festival the success it was.
