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

It's been an interesting and exciting time for the Society. This time *last* year, the AGM had to be rescheduled through lack of a quorum. *This* year, a room full of interested people reaffirmed their commitment to the folkarts and showed their support for their society by participating in the AGM on August 1st. Furthermore, *another* roomful of interested folks turned out just three Sundays later to toss around their suggestions regarding the future of the Melbourne Folk Club.

Both occasions were amicable and fruitful, and our **thanks** go to all who attended or who sent written comments and responses. The *Folk in Victoria* section will give you more information on the subsequent committee decisions regarding the future of the Club.

In the last issue we thanked our retiring committee members; now it's time to say **welcome** to some new ones - there are four of them, all keen to get on with whatever work needs to be done (see opposite page). We'll introduce them properly in next month's issue.

Thanks to Coralie Collins for taking on the very important and time-consuming job of President, and to Sue Harriage for continuing as Treasurer. Also to Dave Brannigan and Hugh MacEwan for continuing on the committee. You'll find Sue's financial report for 92/93 and Coralie's introductory president's report printed in this issue.

The Australian Folk Trust is the 'umbrella' folk body for Australia and as well as throwing its energies into the National Festival, is planning a Residential Summer School in January, 1994 in the Brindabella Ranges near Canberra. The workshops will offer classes in fiddle, accordion, concertina, flute/whistle, didgeridoo and accompaniment with guitar and bouzouki. The emphasis will be on Australian music and dance. Students, who will need to be already at an intermediate level, will enrol for one in-depth class for the week and will work primarily with one or two teachers for that time. It's a very different

concept for the folk scene - far more expensive but also far more in depth than at any other festivals or workshop gathering most of us will have experienced. Congratulations to the Folk Trust for being innovative and adventurous. Look in the Festival Pages for further details and contact numbers if you are interested.

Planning for next year's **National Festival** in Canberra is well under way, and there is information within about performer applications which close on September 30 and about the Declan Affley Songwriting Award.

The **Maldon Folk Festival** at the end of October is also holding a songwriting award as a memorial to Roddy Read. See the ad in this issue.

As you are by now well aware, the "Under the Chicken Tree" performance which was to be on **September 4th** had to be cancelled, but a replacement for this Folk Victoria/Fringe Festival concert was found in brilliant. Sydney singersongwriter, **Alistair Hulett**. Alistair will be performing both at the Broom Factory on the 4th and at the **Melbourne Folk Club** on the **3rd**. I imagine the content could be quite different, so plan to be at both! Other interstate guests this month at the Club will be **John Warner**, who has just moved to Sydney, and four-piece group, **Fresh Air**, from South Australia.

There are a few other **activity ideas** floating around at the moment - an end of year FSDSV dinner, a Victorian Poet's Dinner and award, further workshops, etc. Write and let us know your ideas - or come to a committee meeting with some concrete suggestions.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Society welcomes Coralie Collins to the position of President for 1993/94. Though not herself a performer, Coralie has been involved with folk music, musicians and the FSDSV for many years and is a true lover of the music. She has a keen commitment to the promotion of the folk arts in Victoria and her enthusiasm is infectious. We wish her all the best as she undertakes her new role. Coralie has prepared the following report for this issue of Folkvine:

This report will in essence be a recapitulation of my comments at the A.G.M. I want firstly to thank again all the members who made the effort to attend the A.G.M. and those who were unable to be present and who conveyed their apologies. My thanks also go to all who encouraged me, wished me well and who congratulated me on my decision to stand in 1993/94 as President of the F.S.D.S.V., the future of which, from the feeling of the meeting, clearly is as important to all of you as it is to me.

As many of you know I have been involved with the Society for a long time, a lot longer than indicated by my past six years as a member of the Committee; most recently as Secretary and for three years prior to that as Treasurer. Like so many of you I've also sat on doors, prepared and distributed promotional material, helped out in a variety of capacities at the M.F.C., festivals and other events and participated in the organisation of various Society functions etc. While the decision to accept the nomination for President may therefore have seemed a natural progression, I assure you, as many of you are already aware, this decision has for a number of reasons been a very difficult one. It is a role that I don't take on lightly, one that I know full well will not be easy; one which I know from experience will contain its fair share of frustration, but more importantly of challenge, and also one which I am confident will, with a team approach of committee and members alike be rewarding to the Society and the folklife community as a whole. As the position was not contested this

year I take this opportunity to thank all those present at the A.G.M. for their expression of confidence.

Thank you to those brave, supportive souls who have elected to stand with me for another Committee term and to the new blood for accepting the challenge and the workload a Committee position entails. Thanks are also in order to the members of past Committees, who over the years have shouldered enormous workloads and responsibilities. Of special mention are:

- those who for years carried the role of the Victorian umbrella organisation, which was the de facto Victorian Folk Federation when Victoria, unlike other states had no Folk Federation.
- those who have represented Victoria on the Australian Folk Trust.
- those who struggled for greater recognition for the folkarts in Victoria.
- those who compiled the grants submissions for funding to the M.A.V.
- those who administered the projects/ auspiced these grants for:
- the Victorian Folklife Co-ordinator/
 Administrator positions;
- * the feasibility study into the establishment of a Victorian Folklife and Heritage Centre.
- those who put in place the final structure for the establishment of the Victorian Folklife Association, giving Victoria similar 'Federation' status with other states.

The hard work of previous Committees into projects such as the above has generated an enhanced profile for the F.S.D.S.V., a profile which has given us entree into enterprises such as the Lygon St Festa, Life Be In It, the Celtic and Brunswick Music Festivals and other state festivals, together with the opportunity to work in the promotion of a variety of concert series featuring Victorian, interstate and overseas performers. I therefore share the

concern of many of you, that this high profile is not as stable today as we all might wish.

The establishment of the V.F.A. has lifted many of the past responsibilities. In so doing it has opened the way wide open for today's Society to pursue enthusiastically our aims of preservation, promotion and presentation of the broadest possible spectrum of the folkarts. I hope this is the direction members will pursue over the coming year.

In closing I repeat my thanks to the outgoing Committee members, several of whom have agreed to continue their commitment to various ongoing projects. I offer sincere congratulations to the incoming Committee and ask that others may see their way clear to be co-opted or to volunteer to work on the various sub-committees that will be generated;

but mostly that all will lend their support to the activities organised by members, for members.

You have a new and enthusiastic Committee, but a Committee of nine cannot do it all for you. Your interest, contribution, input and involvement are all essential. If one believes in omens, today's attendance and level of participation at the open meeting on the future direction of the Melbourne Folk Club augers well. Thanks to everyone who gave up a sunny Sunday afternoon to be there and for all your contributions. Thanks also to those who were unable to attend and who took the time to respond to the mail-out in writing.

The following F.S.D.S.V. accounts have been maintained.

- A chequing/operating account, (minimal interest), through which the majority of the funds pass; utilised for the regular operations/business of the Society.
- A cash management/investment account, established to maximise the investment potential for the reserve funds of the Society. The deposits, set aside for the maintenance and replacement of the Society's P.A. System are also retained in this account.
- The Winter Workshop passbook account, which the Society is holding in trust.

The previous National Festival Account has been allocated to the Monaro Folk Music Society as an unsecured loan, for the purpose of their resolving a portion of the debts incurred by the loss made at the 1992 National Festival.

Despite the current economic climate, including the minimal earnings now available from bank interest, the Society has finished the financial year in the BLACK with a NET TRADING INCOME of \$712.80.

Due to some considered decisions and recommendations from last years financial report and also those of the 92/93 committee, the Society shows a NET CASH DEFICIT of \$2,421.46 for the year. As part of our policy to regularly update the current assets of the Society the decision was made to purchase five new microphones at a cost of \$1100.00 and to sell part of the old P.A. system. This occasioned the need for a re-evaluation of the Society's P.A. equipment. The above mentioned, three year interest free loan of \$5000 to Monaro Folk Music Society has also contributed to the deficit indicated this financial year.

The number of Membership subscriptions for the 1992/93 financial year has increased substantially. An early Committee decision to curtail the size of the newsletter reduced the overall expenditure on this item, thus allowing for some of the membership income to be used for other Society priorities. Income generated over the year from special functions has shown an increase of approximately \$300.

Promotion of Victorian performers was given a high profile, with the decision to give \$1500 in sponsorship for the F.S.D.S.V. component for the Victorian Folklife Concert at the National Folk Festival.

The Melbourne Folk Club this year, due to a substantial fall in income has unfortunately had to reduce its level of payment to performers. My suggestion of a way to overcome this would be, that the organisation of at least two large scale concerts, with well known performers, be scheduled for Folk Club nights. While the MFC NET INCOME indicates a small profit, the Society policy to apportion 10% of the door to the replacement and maintenance of P.A. equipment has occasioned an actual Folk Club loss of just over \$400.

It should be taken into account that the income generated from record, tape and C.D. sales has increased this year by \$350. Thanks go to all those who regularly patronise this service at the Folk Club.

This has been a learning year for me and I must thank Coralie for all the help and support she has given me over this financial year.


