With thoughts of Coralie

Coralie and I were friends through many years and shared our lives in big things and small: happiness and heartbreak, laughter and tears, achievements and disappointments, music and books, meals and shopping...and so much more...even on one week-end last year, her dancing shoes! The friendship between us, we realised, was a gift, and we treasured it. Yet now, as so many memories fill my mind, I find myself struggling to write about her...and I feel overwhelmed. How impossible it is, to try to encapsulate nearly two-and-a-half decades of friendship in only a few lines.

So I share with you something of what Coralie shared with me. I wrote it, for myself, in December 2002, after Coralie told me she felt lucky to have been diagnosed with cancer...lucky because the diagnosis had given her time – and given those whom she loved and who loved her time – to fulfil life-long dreams, to share special times, and for her to come to a sense of peace.

When life grows tough, don't be forlorn

Don't let its trials make you feel torn

Accept the changes that must be

And try to reach a peace, to see

They're part of His big plan.

Life can be rough, can seem unfair,
When the burden, it seems, is hard to bear
