We participated again in the Brunswick Music Festival and hope to do so again in 2007. Our financial state is secure, allowing for the ongoing administration of the Society, the Folk Club and our other folk events, for the costs involved in the Graham Squance Memorial Award certificate and book, and for some contributions to other worthy folk projects. We acknowledged the work of all the committee, and expressed hopes

that more folk could become involved. We have had a couple of offers of willing hands already - the more the merrier!

# Folk Club

Though numbers were down for our October Folk Club and the Faerd concert, the music was fabulous on both nights. On Friday October 6th we sang our lungs out with Danny Spooner and friends and danced our feet off to Conundrum's great Celtic music! On October 10th, touring Scandanavian band "Faerd" were totally spellbinding - don't miss them if they are back - and "Grand Junction" provided a lively support bracket. On November 3<sup>rd</sup> Kenny White and friends packed out the Emerald Room for Kenny's CD launch - fantastic acoustic blues and a great trip down memory lane. December 1st was another packed-out evening, with a short but much-enjoyed bracket from Susan McCarta, carol singing with Danny Spooner, Duncan Brown, John O'Leary and yours truly, the presentation of the annual Graham Squance Award to Judy Turner (see below), a bracket from Judy with Neil Adam and members of the Melbourne Scottish Fiddle Club, and a lively finish provided by "The Senile Delinquants". It was great to hear a spirited jam session still going when I left at 11.45pm!

# Graham Squance Memorial Award

Part of the ongoing tradition of the FSDSV involves honouring those who have made longstanding and valuable contributions to the folklife of our country. The Society's presentation of the annual Graham Squance Award aims to do just that.

The Award was initiated by the Port Phillip Folk Festival Committee in 1971 in memory of Graham Squance, a blues musician who was killed in a road accident while travelling to Canberra in 1970 to take part in a Folk Festival. Awards have been given every year but two since 1971. The "Roll of Honour" book which records these awards has become a wonderful historical document and makes great

Graham himself was a very fine performer who also involved himself in many aspects of presenting folk music and folklore to the general public. He was actively involved in the organisation of the earliest Folk Festivals held in Melbourne.

The earlier awards were made "to a deserving person" to enable that person to attend the National Festival for that year. The awards were monetary and were the equivalent of a second class rail fare to wherever the festival was being held. (Performers received little or no payment then.)

Over time the award changed to a scroll, then to the current beautifully framed certificate. The range of areas of service for which the award has been made is enormous - from performance of music, song and the spoken word to involvement in dance, folk radio, folk festival organisation and general society involvement and 'leg work'.

As I mentioned above, the award was presented this year on Friday December 1<sup>st</sup> to fiddle player Judy Turner. Her citation reads:

"In recognition of Judy's skill and enthusiasm as a musician and performer, her dedication to the teaching and promotion if fiddle music of Scottish origin, and the warmth and passion she has demonstrated in encouraging and nurturing fiddle players of all ages and abilities through her role as founder and director of the Melbourne Scottish Fiddle Club".

Judy has been playing violin and viola since her school days, and has consequently been an inspirational teacher of the



instruments in schools and workshops across the country. Her love of folk music stemmed in part from her family background - her father, Ian Turner, played a leading role in the Australian folk revival in the 1950's. Judy joined her first folk band in 1978. Her most renowned band involvement prior to the Fiddle Club was with the folk/bush band 'Paradiddle', between 1979 and 1986. She has also played with family bands, including 'The Bruce Brothers'. Two years in Boston from 1993-95 saw her falling hook, line and sinker for Scottish and Cape Breton fiddle music. On her return she formed the Melbourne Scottish Fiddle Club, which has seen over 150 players of all ages and abilities go through its ranks. Since 1996 she has also played in a duo with Neil Adam, and in their family band 'New Dogs Old Tricks'. Six CDs have resulted from these involvements between 1999 and 2006. As the citation reads, she has been inspirational as teacher, leader, musician and friend to many. Well done Judy.

# Vale Julia Ross (nee Pascoe)

John Ross' beautiful wife Julia sadly lost her very courageous battle with cancer on Tuesday morning, November 28<sup>th</sup>. She passed away at their home in Yandoit, Central Victoria, and many of John and Julia's family and friends gathered for the funeral and wake on Saturday December 2nd.

For those who didn't know Julia, she was a treasure who shone with vibrancy, integrity, adventure, humour and friendship. After many travel adventures from her native England, she found her way to Brunswick 15 years ago and she and John were drawn together in a strong and loving partnership. John himself was involved in the Melbourne folk scene for many years, including the FSDSV, as a performer, organiser, and PA operator. John and Julia more recently moved to a house on a hill in Yandoit and were married two years ago. They have been familiar figures at Nariel Creek Folk Festival for many years, their beautiful voices and guitar playing wafting through the trees at all hours of day and night. They were also regularly heard in the Guildford Pub and many other places where singers and musicians gather. Our love and sympathies go to John, and his and Julia's friends and family in this difficult time.

# Vale Lenore Somerset

Folk Victoria Members and friends with long memories may be saddened to hear of the passing of LENORE SOMERSET, one of the big names on the Melbourne scene during the 60s folk revival. Lenore is perhaps best remembered for her booming alto voice, big 12 strong guitar and mighty renditions of 'Ox Driver's Song', 'Hava Nagila', 'Brisbane Ladies', etc. After many years in retirement she reconnected briefly with the "folk community" a couple of years ago when she performed a couple of heartwarming, nostalgic sets at Rhythm & Views and the East Brunswick Hotel. A few months before her death Lenore was honoured with a' HANDS of FAME' citation at Tamworth Festival.

# Vale Wendy Lowenstein

The year has also seen the passing, on October 16<sup>th</sup>, of prominent folklorist, oral historian, teacher and writer WENDY LOWENSTEIN at age 79. One of the pioneers of the Australian sector of the revival (and a significant behind-the-scenes player), Wendy co-funded the Folklore Society of Victoria in 1955 and was editor of the GUMSUCKER'S GAZETTE and its successor AUSTRALIAN TRADITION from 1961-76. In 1969 she and her family spent a year travelling around Australia and collecting songs and folk-tales. She subsequently ran the Boree Log Folk Club at the Pram Factory. Wendy was passionate about her politics, worker's rights and working class history. She was an activist and a fierce campaigner, and was involved in numerous organisations throughout her life. She was driven by her belief in the power and importance of the story of the individual and their direct experiences. Wendy's prodigious research collection and papers are now held by the National Library. Her work and passion will go on touching people and urging them to maintain the fight to keep Australia decent and humane.
