UMANEE was formed in 2004 by Peter Novotnik – composer and multi-instrumentalist from Poland, who gathered few talented musicians with diverse musical backgrounds to create a unique and original sound project inspired by Scandinavian, French, Middle Eastern and Balkan traditions. Band members now include Peter (hurdy-gurdy, baglama, khushtar, oud and kemence), Bill Thompson (rhythm), Dushan Mitrovic (clarinet), Michael O'Connor (flute) and Keryn Lientshnig (cello and viola)

Together with original material, Umanee has made the effort to reintroduce forgotten musical traditions and instruments like hurdy-gurdy, Uyghur Khushtar, Karadeniz Kemence, Turkish Baglama – and blend them with classical ones (clarinet, flute, cello) to give their music new, contemporary level.
