Greetings All

Yes it has been a while since I've written those words to you. Since January my time and my thoughts have been chiefly involved with my dear 88-year old mum who finally passed away in March after breaking her hip in a fall. The music continues to "power on" at the Clifton Hill Hotel, though we took an Easter break in April.

February 2nd was our first night for the year, and I was honoured to be able to perform on the same bill as singer **Gavin Moore** from Ireland, and the wonderful Melbourne singer **Monica Weightman**.

On **March 2nd Marni Sheehan and many friends** launched Marni's latest CD "Inside Stories" in front of a large crowd.

Folk Victoria once again this year sponsored a concert for the **Brunswick Music Festival**, this time in the Mechanics Institute on Thursday **March 22nd.** It was a wonderful night with the **Melbourne Scottish Fiddle Club** small orchestra presenting an exciting bracket to warm us up for the magic and musical wizardry of **Nancy Kerr and James Fagan**.

We'd like to congratulate **John McAuslan** and his team for yet another great **Brunswick Music Festival** - it must be unique to have a city festival running for a month or so presenting such a huge array of quality music.

Friday May 4th sees a quartet of terrific Melbourne singers and songwriters take to the stage in the Emerald Room of the Clifton Hill Hotel. Wendy Ealey, Neil Robertson, Leticia Maher and Moira Tyers are collectively "UNSUNG". Individually, they are all talented and award winning musicians, singers and songwriters with their own style and influences range.

ing from folk, blues and jazz through to rock, pop and country. They come together as Unsung to produce powerful and intelligent contemporary music that will make you think, laugh, cry, and dance. With four unique voices, four acoustic guitars, a bit of fiddle, their treasured percussive egg, great songs and huge vocal harmonies, *Unsung* will lift you up and carry you away with them.

On **Friday June 1st**, our featured artists will be **Rebecca Rigby**, a young Melbourne singer with an exquisite voice, accompanied by guitarist **Dale Packard**, and the trio "**The Beggars**", on tour all the way from Adelaide.

Vale Billy Moran

We were saddened earlier this year to hear of the passing of one of the most generous-hearted men and talented musicians the Melbourne folk scene has had the privilege to know. The following tributes come from David O'Brien (VFMC "Tradition" magazine), the Blarney Bulletin, and musician Wendy Reed.

"Although only a small man in stature, Billy Moran was a giant in the field of Irish traditional music in his adoptive home of Australia. He was a well-known fixture at many festivals, at the Lake School in Koroit, and at the Quiet Man Hotel in Flemington.

Billy was born in Co Galway in 1928. At the age of five he was given a single row melodeon and never stopped playing (although he did advance to more sophisticated boxes). I have known Billy to play all day and well into the night and if his wife Eileen wasn't around he would just keep on playing through mealtimes as long as he had a pint nearby. I met Billy at the Lake School and was immediately struck by his kindness and friendliness. As Felix Meagher said, "he was one of the most generous men around".

Billy came to Australia as an L10 immigrant and worked on the Snowy River Scheme, Maralinga, Altona and Eildon Weir. He married Eileen in 1963 and they had three children - Micky, Annette and Sean.

Billy won many awards - the Graham Squance Award, Legend of the Lake, a certificate from the Comhaltas Ceoltoiri and the Australian Folk Federation award for his contribution to Irish music. Goodbye Billy and thanks for that cheeky Irish grin and enjoy the craic up there." David O'Brien with info from the Blarney Bulletin.

"I want to convey mine and my son Nic's deepest sympathy to Eileen, Michael, Anet, Sean and family on the passing of Billy Moran my dear friend, fellow muso and mentor and indeed friend and mentor to so many. Your tribute to Billy brought tears to my eyes as I recalled those agile fingers pressing and squeezing out a tune on one of his many beloved boxes. I will never forget the first night I heard him play a slow aire while we sat beside the campfire in the Gardens Caravan Park at one of the early Port Fairy Folk Festivals back in the late seventies. It was a beautiful Scottish tune, "The Mist over the Mountain", for although Billy was a proud Irish man from Oranmore out from Galway city, he loved to play the Scottish airs and reels, the likes of which Jimmy Shand made famous. Maybe the reel the "Bucks of Oranmore" could have been his signature tune, but then he had so many favourites.

My memory of Billy goes back 3 decades, many sessions, late night gigs in darkened pub corners, house sessions, folk festivals especially recalling Sydney Festival washed out and with our tents saturated we found shelter in a room full of the International guests including Aelish O'Connor, Cooney and the Greeks, the Band from Brunswick for the many festival memories, while stumbling through the ruins of Port Arthur, while relaxing in the Timboon and Brucknell bush. When he played with his regular session mates Simon Meillor dec, Tony O'Rourke, Sean Keane and his late brother, Joe Fitzgerald and family, Helen O'Shea, Pat Tannerhill, Sean McLernan, Paddy McKusker (dec), sons Michael and Sean, Beth Knight, the country Warrnambool lads, Tony, Lex, and co, Felix Meagher, Irish lads and lasses who happened to be in town, for the Morans have an open house, full of fun, merriment, dogs barking, birds whistling and his budgie calling "get out your box Billy", for his little dog that gave an incredible howl while diving head first off his kitchen table into my handbag while trying to route out the source of the sound from my wooden flute. We all remember Billy's fond love of Bobby his dog that he buried in his back garden erecting the little wooden cross over his body and I believe this to be spot where he often stood not talking to the fence but talking to his beloved Bobby. Billy was a thinker and staunch labour, intrepid worker and never afraid to offer a hand in moving furniture or some other task, and an Irish man who loved, life and a party. I hear that his final weeks were no exception, a continual session at the house - I was with him in spirit if not in flesh.

He played at so many festivals and gatherings that I recall and so many too numerous to mention recalling but a few Canberra National, Melbourne Folk at LaTrobe Uni, early Port Fairy's when we all felt like one big family, in the session pubs at 'Victoria's oldest, "the Stump", the Vic and the Caledonian, Dan O'Connell Pub, Maldon, Kilmore, Geelong, and finally returning to his native shores of Ireland after a 35 year absence to meet family and old friends who came back from all parts of the world to meet up with him. He is so fondly remembered playing for the many young and not so young Irish lads in the Normanby Hotel on a Saturday night with them calling to him, "Play us another Billy", for the nights with Tara and the lads in the Band from London, Maria Forde as she began her singing career and more recently his stoic Quiet Man sessions. For the many Paddy's Day marches for Phyllis McGrath, the South Melbourne Irish, down at Garvoc Pub and the Irish/Aus Welfare Bureau, Paddy O'Neil at Comhaltas and for the Royal Children's Hospital Appeals, his band

"The Gaels" with Felix and Tony O'Rourke to name a few but unfortunately to leave out many. He is sorely missed by those who were touched by Billy and his interest in giving you a tune and sharing his music

I admired Billy for his amazing musical agility with or without a glass of stout, for his tenacity and drive that one can only pray for in this life even up to his last months, for being a great family man and constant companion to his wife Eileen and family and as well as his Irish and Aussie mates in his adopted home Australia. The man who's eyes lit up when one of his young students managed a few accordion notes on the tricky B/C row.

I was privileged to know the man, to learn some of his tunes and to witness a metamorphosis from the larrikin we loved to the upstanding citizen whom we admired, whose mantelpiece with it's countless trophies bears witness to the fact that he became one of Ireland's great emigrants, the man who not only built the roads but walked the mile on them, and enticed us to go with him on that journey.

May we remember our great friend Billy, mentor, companion for his memory will live on each time we hear and play his music.
