From the President

Annual General Meeting:

Many thanks to those of you who have given us some feed-back concerning the Folk Club, the newsletter and the society in general.

We hope as many as possible can come along to our **Annual General Meeting on Thursday November** 18th at 8pm in the meeting room of the Lomond Hotel, cnr Nicholson and Blythe Sts, Brunswick. (Ask the bar staff to direct you.) Please consider if there is something you can offer to keep Folk Victoria viable and vibrant – or just come along to show your support.

Meals are available at reasonable prices. If you wish to come along for a meal before the AGM, from 6.30pm, you will be most welcome to join those of us on the committee who are also gathering early in the back room. Food and drinks can be ordered from the bar. The bar has some great music on a Thursday night, so stay on for a good night out.

As outgoing President, I want to thank all those who have served on the various committees during my time at the helm. The **mission** of Folk Victoria has been to promote, present, support, develop, collect



and preserve folk and acoustic music, song and dance within our community, and I believe that the society has continued to be successful on a number of levels in achieving outcomes in line with that mission.

Annual Graham Squance Memorial Award:

Part of the ongoing tradition of the FSDSV involves honouring those who have made longstanding and valuable contributions to the folklife of our country. The Society's presentation of the annual Graham Squance Award aims to do just that.

The award was initiated by the Port Phillip Folk Festival Committee (the precursor of the FSDSV) in 1971 in memory of Graham Squance, a blues musician who was killed in a road accident while travelling to Canberra in 1970 to take part in a Folk Festival. Awards have been given every year but two

since 1971. The "Roll of Honour" book which records these awards has become a wonderful historical document and makes great reading.

Graham himself was a very fine performer who also involved himself in many aspects of presenting folk music and folklore to the general public. He was actively involved in the organisation of the earliest Folk Festivals held in Melbourne.



The earlier awards were made "to a deserving person" to enable that person to attend the National Festival for that year. The awards were monetary and were the equivalent of a second class rail fare to wherever the festival was being held. (Performers received little or no payment then.)

Over time the award changed to a scroll, then to the current beautifully framed certificate. The range of areas of service for which the award has been made is enormous – from performance of music, song and the spoken word to involvement in dance, folk radio, recording, folk festival organisation and general society involvement and 'leg work'.

We are pleased to announce that this year's recipient is to be Andrew **Pattison.** Andrew has been involved for many years in organising venues and events which have showcased and encouraged all manner of folk and acoustic performers. I will publish more of Andrew's story in the next newsletter.



We will be presenting the award at Andrew's popular Wine Bar venue during the Newstead Live! Folk Festival which Andrew and his team will be running at Newstead in Central Victoria from the 21st to the 24th of January, 2011. I will let you know in the next newsletter exactly when the presentation will be made.
