WHAT'S ON AT VICTORIAN FOLK MUSIC CLUB

<u>Session nights</u>: The Club meets **each Tuesday** evening at **Ringwood Uniting** Church Hall, 30-32 Station Street. Sessions run from 7.45 pm to 9.15 pm. The format varies each week of the month, and visitors are welcome to attend and join in, or just sit and observe if preferred.

Week 1 & 3 Round Robin: singing, playing, reciting, yarns, solo, group, etc.

Week 4 All-In Session: group playing of set tunes, dance sets, group singing

Week 5 Theme Night: workshops, 'Hot Spots' or open stage nights

Admission for **Round Robin** and **All-in Sessions** is \$6 for members, \$7 non-members. Cash at the door or pay by card. Accompanied children no charge.

<u>Concerts</u>: Tuesday of Week 2, featuring top acoustic performers plus floor spots. The concert is from 7.45 to 10pm with a supper break at 8.45pm. Same hall as the sessions. Admission is \$10 members to \$14, cash or card at the door or purchase tickets online from Humanitix. Accompanied children no charge.

<u>Dance Events</u>: Family Bush Dance 1st Saturday evening each month except January, Ringwood East Senior Citizen's Hall. Bands vary and dances called. Admission is \$10 members to \$12. No charge for accompanied children.

Children's Dance is 2-3pm on 3rd Saturday during school terms. \$5 per child or \$10 per family. Accompanying adults no charge.

Online access via Zoom: All Tuesdays except week 4 currently available via Zoom for those unable to attend the venue. Concerts also broadcast via Zoom. Tickets must be bought in advance via Humanitix—see website to book.

CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW—MARCH

The March Concert was MC'd by Steve who opened the night with a good tale of Paddy And The Rope. Steve related the recent passing of long time Club member Jim Smith, and handed over to fellow poet and friend of Jim's, Stephen Whiteside, for a fitting obituary.



Jim will be well known and remembered by all who follow bush poetry and yarns, as he was an expert with an uncanny memory for lengthy and spellbinding pieces. Jim would often host the Poets' Breakfasts at festivals and could deliver both wryly humorous and deadly acerbic verse with great recall. He would occasionally accompany himself on concertina, his memorable piece Peter Kagan and the Wind by Gordon Bok, an eerie tale that could hold the attention of audiences from start to finish.

On the subject of poets passing, we note the recent news of another loss, that of UK poet Les Barker. Like Jim he could be incredibly funny and the next very direct and pointed. Thanks Stephen for the fine words on Jim.

The Bennetswood Ukulele Group, ably led by Margaret Creighton, opened the Spot Acts with a couple of well presented songs accompanied on their little ukes, The Sloop John B and an interesting These Boots Are Made For Walking, from the perspective of the many community uke groups around. Well done BAUG.





A couple of fine songs from Maggie Somerville followed: first a poem of John Shaw Neilson called Love's Coming, put to her tune, then Henry Lawson's poem about the habit of men going to England for a wife.

Robyn, Ken and Don from Pleasant and Delightful did a salute to The Foghorn String Band with a couple of their lively songs: Golden Slippers and Bring Back My Blue Eyed Boy To Me.



Barb Parry often visits Club Sessions from the UK via Zoom so it was good to catch up with her on her current visit. She, with Rick on mandolin and Bill on fiddle, formed a nice trio as they sang the traditional folk songs: The Blacksmith and The Parting Glass.

Dominic and Dieter capped off the Spot acts with the old German song, The Rose, beautifully played on harmonica and guitar, and the well-known Italian trumpet tune of the 1960's, Il Silenzio, by Nini Rosso. Thanks to all the talented Spot acts - some great music presented this night.

CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW (CONTINUED)

MAIN ACT:

The Main Act this month was UK folk stalwart Martyn Wyndham-Read. His first song was sung unaccompanied: The Banks Of The Reedy Lagoon, an excellent introduction to his wonderful voice and presentation style of Australian folk songs.

Martyn has been involved with folk music for over sixty years. Early on he left his native England and spent a number of years in the Australian outback where he became interested in our old folk songs from the station hands, which resulted in him now being one of the finest presenters of Aussie folk songs anywhere. In Memory Of Bill was a touching song of an old swaggie.



A light hearted poem of Mickety Mulga Jim introduced The Creaking Of The Saddle. Martin tells a good story, and introduced Graeme Miles' song, Sam Hill, who emigrated to Otago in NZ. Henry Lawson apparently observed that 'drinking beer makes you feel how you should feel when not drinking beer'. Genoa is a pretty song relating Lawson's love affair with a girl in that city.

Mike O'Connor wrote Shining Down On Sennen, how the stars that shine down on Cornwall also no doubt shine down on the Cornish miners who emigrated to the copper triangle of Moonta, Kadina and Walaroo in South Australia. A personal note here: on hearing this lovely song by Martin a few years ago I was inspired to spend some time exploring this area on the York Peninsula.

John Beavis, who happened to be in the audience, wrote the good lilting song The New Road. And The Aged Stockman was a good story too.

Away to Tintinarra told the story of a train ride to his first job in the outback in SA. Some verse followed about an old timer who had a desire for drink a bit beyond his best interests. Fare Thee Well was a traditional folk song of love sung unaccompanied.

Martyn put Lawson's poem Possum Land to his own tune. (This is also on his latest album, which was on sale at the concert.)

He then called Dominic and Dieter up to accompany him on Old Whitby Harbour, a Stan Graham song about the seaside town in England.



The audience requested an encore and Martyn, being the gentleman he is, obliged with Graeme Miles' song, My Eldorado. The late Vin Garbutt sang this lovely song a couple of years ago at Newstead—sadly very memorable for me as he too passed away soon after.

The Club appreciates your support for the live music scene by patronising these Concerts. It keeps the whole live music scene healthy. VFMC is a not for profit organization. We pay our Main Act performers well and love to see new people having a go as a Spot Act or Support Act.

Thanks to the many who made this such a successful night.

Next month another fine captivating voice, the ever popular Khristian Mizzi, will be our Main Act.

Jim Smith - In Remembrance



Reciter, button accordion player and long-time VFMC member Jim Smith died peacefully on Sunday 12th March after a long illness. Jim had attended the Port Fairy Folk Festival on many occasions during its early days, so it is perhaps fitting that he died during this year's festival. He was also very active during the early days of the National Folk Festival. In recent years, he regularly hosted the Poets' Breakfasts at Andrew Pattison's Newstead Live! He also frequently recited at VFMC club nights, and sometimes as a 'spot act' on a concert night.

I think I probably first met Jim at the Port Fairy Folk Festival in 1984. His passion for the craft of reciting was total and all-consuming. Jim committed huge slabs of text to memory, and never carried the poem with him to refer to if needed. In recent years, his failing memory had been the source of great frustration to him. Something of a perfectionist, he eventually stopped reciting altogether, which was a pity.

Jim didn't just learn the work of the rhyming/bush poets - Paterson, Lawson, Ogilvie, etc. He also recited the works of Kenneth Slessor, John Shaw Neilson, Ian Mudie and many others. Indeed, he was quite critical of what he saw as the takeover of the National Folk Festival's Poets' Breakfast by the 'bush poets'.


One of Jim's signature pieces was 'They'll Tell You About Me' by Mudie. Another was 'Peter Kagan and the Wind' by the American folk singer Gordon Bok. He also loved 'Lanes of Woolloomooloo' (John Dengate), 'The Sandy Hollow Line' (Duke Tritton), 'The Griesly Wife' (John Manifold) and 'Burnt Norton' (Graham Jenkin). Curiously, my all-time favourite poet, C. J. Dennis, was one poet Jim didn't really like very much at all. He did, however, recite Dennis' 'An Old Master' and 'A Post Cup Tale.' There is no greater compliment that a reciter can pay a poet than to recite his poems, and Jim recited several of mine over the years. He was equally at home with the highbrow and the low, and recorded several albums of his recitations. He was quite a shy person, and would often simply greet you by reciting some lines from the poem he was currently memorising. He had worked as a bookseller, and had a deep respect for literature, and the process of publishing. His knowledge of the history of Australian poetry was encyclopaedic. Jim was a guiding light for me, helping me to understand what was important, and why.

When Maggie Somerville joined me in my search for a house some years ago, we stumbled into a display featuring Jim at the Fairfield Canoe Club. I was stunned, and when I quizzed him about it he confirmed that, yes, he had been a very keen canoeist in his younger days. He had even served as a junior official on the canoeing course at the Melbourne Olympics! An old canoe served as a garden bed in the front garden of his home.

I have attended a good number of Poets' Breakfasts (and other poetry events) over the years. I cannot think of another reciter with anything close to Jim's level of passion and commitment, or his breadth and depth of knowledge. He will be missed by many.
