WHAT'S ON AT VICTORIAN FOLK MUSIC CLUB

<u>Session nights</u>: The Club meets **each Tuesday** evening at **Ringwood Uniting** Church Hall, 30-32 Station Street. Sessions run from 7.45 pm to 9.15 pm. The format varies each week of the month, and visitors are welcome to attend and join in, or just sit and observe if preferred.

Week 1 & 3 Round Robin: singing, playing, reciting, yarns, solo, group, etc.

Week 4 All-In Session: group playing of set tunes, dance sets, group singing

Week 5 Theme Night: workshops, 'Hot Spots' or open stage nights

Admission for **Round Robin** and **All-in Sessions** is \$6 for members, \$7 non-members. Cash at the door or pay by card. Accompanied children no charge.

<u>Concerts</u>: Tuesday of Week 2, featuring top acoustic performers plus floor spots. The concert is from 7.45 to 10pm with a supper break at 8.45pm. Same hall as the sessions. Admission is \$10 members to \$14, cash or card at the door or purchase tickets online from Humanitix. Accompanied children no charge.

<u>Dance Events</u>: Family Bush Dance 1st Saturday evening each month except January, Ringwood East Senior Citizen's Hall. Bands vary and dances called. Admission is \$10 members to \$12. No charge for accompanied children.

Children's Dance is 2-3pm on 3rd Saturday during school terms. \$5 per child or \$10 per family. Accompanying adults no charge.

Online access via Zoom: In July Week 1 Tuesday will be available via Zoom for those unable to attend the venue, and Week 2 Concert also broadcast via Zoom. Tickets must be bought in advance via Humanitix—see website to book.



CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW—JUNE 2023

SPOT ACTS:

Our intended guest artists for the evening Sarah and Silas were unable to perform for the club at the last minute due to illness. We look forward to enjoying the duo at our December Concert.

The day before the concert Maree Buttler drew upon the wide range of musical talent of our own club members and put together a night of great entertainment.

<u>The Billabong Band</u> took centre stage and Rob was first, playing the mandolin as he sang a traditional folk song, *All for me Grog*. Originally a sea shanty, the song has been adopted into the folk world as a song of a man's ruination due to his love of beer and tobacco.

This was followed by Maree singing *On the Road to Gundagai* accompanied by Trevor, Margie and others.

Margie then sang about *Grandfather's Piano*, a man of eighty-seven playing his eighty-eight note piano.

Next, Michael Hassett sang a song written by Pete Titchener about his mother, *The Girl in the Photo*. The pretty dancer in the pretty white dress.

Maggie finished off the set with a rousing rendition of *Dumbarton's Drums*.

Mick Kearon, prize-winning songwriter and folk singer, entertained with three songs. The first was about the paddle boats which brought the wool clip down the country's river system from the outback to the coast, from where the cargo was then sent off to England.

Then Farewell my Emerald Isle, a poignant song about immigration, leaving behind all you love for the promise of a better life far away.



Finally, a song about Boydtown in southern New South Wales, the site of a whaling station in the past when men chanced their luck whale hunting in the Southern Ocean.

Joan and Ray Mundy have always been enthusiastic members of the club and supported the VFMC in many different ways over the years. Their contributions to the success of the club's many activities including dances cannot be underestimated. It is fitting indeed that recently this wonderful couple was awarded Lifetime Membership. After very short notice as they were on their way home from attending the Portarlington National Celtic Festival, they came along to play for the concert. With Ray on guitar,



Joan on accordion and accompanied by Mick Kearon on bodhran (Irish drum), they began their set with *Farquhar's Waltz* followed by *Josephine's Waltz*. Then a typical song from the gold era about a young girl trying to steal gold from a miner in Nuggetty Gully. They finished off with a Flemish polka and a couple of jigs, including *Kilkenny Girl*.



Bill and Maree Buttler began their performance with The Calton Weaver, also known as Nancy Whisky. A song about the weavers of Calton, a town which today has been absorbed into the city of Glasgow in Scotland. Maree's beautiful harp playing, accompanied by Bill's guitar, presented Will You Go Lassie Go/Wild Mountain Thyme, always a favourite of the audience, who enthusiastically joined in the singing and continued singing along in the next popular tune, Caledonia.

Maggie Somerville sang about one of her most favourite places, Waratah Bay in South Gippsland. Her words express her joy in the magic beauty of the bay at different times of the day until the hush at the end of the day. Then Maree accompanied Maggie on the harp as she sang a John Shaw Nielson poem which she has set to music: When are the Angels Nearest? Next, a tribute to Maggie's greatest friend in winter, her hot water bottle. The words to the chorus for How I Love My Hottie were passed around and everybody raised their voices and sang about how they love their hottie on a chilly wintry night and how when they hug their hottie bottie they feel alright.

Michael and Max sang a beautiful song by Johnny McEvoy, *The Town I Left Behind*. It's about Banagher in Co Offaly, which is his home town. Johnny's brother went to America and the song is a reminder of the town of his birth which he says... You'll be my town until the day I die.

They followed with Michael on harmonica and Max on guitar playing a traditional American gospel song, *Lonesome Valley*.





Dominic Martin was the final artist for the evening. He began with a Ewen McColl song *Come me Little Laddie*. A mother explains to her son how his absent father loves them enough to spend so much time away earning money building the English Motorway.

Then a Woodie Guthrie song *The Deportees* about a truly terrible plane crash in Los Gatos Canyon in the USA in 1948. Migrant Mexican fruit pickers died in a crash in the canyon and Woody immortalized them in his song. Dominic finished off the evening with a rousing rendition of the old sea shanty, *Santiano!* with the audience singing along enthusiastically.

Thank you to all of the artists who worked together to present an entertaining and well-rounded evening of folk songs and tunes.

Thanks also to all of the volunteers who worked together to make the evening run on oiled wheels.

Next month: the great bush band, Dingo's Breakfast. The support act for the evening will be The Limoncellos.

Plans for Sessions from July

Zoom access was set up to maintain continuity over the Covid lockdowns, and has worked really well. With a return to face to face in-hall meetings this year Zoom access has been continued, with the result that a number of people still 'attend Sessions' on-line.

However, the provision of Zoom takes a lot of time, effort and expertise. We feel that some rationalisation has to take place as the human resources are well overstretched, even though some still use it.

The proposal at present is that Zoom access be available for the Session on July 4th and the Concert on July 11th. There will be no Zoom for the other Sessions on weeks 3, 4 and 5, which will be in-hall only and which may be modified to accommodate the changes.

The Committee decided in October 2022 that a trial would run until June 2023. Attendance statistics would be kept, after which discussion would take place on whether Zoom should be reduced, modified, cancelled or continued.

So at present the **Session on July 4th**, and the **Concert on July 11th** will both be available on Zoom. A decision will be made soon on continuing Zoom access to both Sessions and Concerts past July.
