## CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW—APRIL 2024

### SPOT ACTS:

The MC for the April Concert was Maree, who introduced first Spot Act: Pleasant and Delightful, who are Robyn, Kristen, Ken and Don. Just before WW1, two Americans, Alonzo Elliott and Stoddard King wrote Long Long Trail, which with its march-like tempo was soon to become a popular song associated with men marching off to an uncertain future. They then got the audience singing along to the Mingulay Boat Song.



Stephen Whiteside related a story of his early days exploring the high country of Victoria, specifically around Spargo's Hut which later developed into an interest in researching the history of this hut. While travelling around the state, Stephen took every opportunity he could to find out more on the history of this hut and the people who lived in it. Eventually he nominated the hut for protection to the Historic Buildings Council of Victoria and went on to talk to various relatives and friends of the original inhabitants. For the last five years he has been putting together a book which will soon be launched at Mt Hotham on the Monarch's Birthday in June. It is called 'Snow Fire and Gold'. A fascinating story on some of our early pioneers. Thanks Stephen.

Bill Buttler followed with the lovely Irish song, Oro Mo Bhaidin, recorded by Mary O'Hara and many others and accompanied with his gentle guitar. Being in Gaelic, Bill explained the meaning of the words, basically 'Let's get the sail up (on the curragh) and we'll sail away together and we won't come back till tomorrow'. etc. etc..

**CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW (CONTINUED)****SUPPORT ACT:**

Linn Phipps is from the UK and familiar to most members through our Zoom Sessions during the Covid pandemic so it was nice to see her in person. She sang a few shanties, Haul Away Joe and The Hogs Eye Man, then a variant of The Shamrock Shore from Ireland. Two Scottish Gaelic songs followed, the second a lullaby. Next, a Harry Robertson song, followed by Andy's Gone With Cattle from the Henry Lawson poem.

Bruce Watson joined Linn on one of his fine poignant songs, The Amazon. 'In the time it takes to sing this song, there'll be four acres cleared in the Amazon'.

*CONCERT NIGHT (continued):***MAIN ACT:**

The Main Act was Dinkum Bohos, Vasudha Harte and Jem Edwards. Vasudha has a gorgeous voice and plays the harp beautifully while Jem is a fine player of the classic and flamenco guitar, notwithstanding that he is recovering from serious injury to his hands after coming off a motorbike. They have been playing together since 2008 and for the past two years have been residents of Healesville, coming from the golden east coast beaches in the Byron Bay area.



Their music is varied but held together mainly with the harp and Vasudha's nice clear voice. A self-composed song on reconciliation started their bracket, then O'Carolan's Si Beg Si Mor with Jem playing tin whistle. Jem made the magnificent harp which Vasudha explained the workings of before playing it so beautifully. She Moved Through The Fair suits the harp very well, and a lullaby. Auldyn River by Paul Cringle is a popular piece for harp. A tune on accordion from Amelie followed.

With a few moments of instruction on the steps to Zorba's Dance Vasudha had some in the audience up which was a lot of fun. A flamenco tune demonstrated Jem's constant requirement to retune the guitar, apparently accordions are tuned a tad sharp. I play both but didn't know that, so apologies if I've ever been off key on occasion. Anyway Vasudha is pretty skilled on the castanets as well. The traditional Black Is The Colour Of My True Love's Hair was next, then a rather pretty self composed song called I Am The Sky. The High Priestess is a salute to mothers everywhere with nice guitar from both before Vasudha moved to the harp for a very pleasing finish to the night.

What an interesting and varied night, some lovely music from Ireland, Scotland, England, Australia, Spain and elsewhere. Next month Maggie Somerville and friends will be Main Act and will also be launching her double cd of poems of Henry Lawson and John Shaw Neilson. A very big thanks to all who contributed to organising and running the night. See you next month.

## **My Easter weekend at the National Folk Festival in Canberra**

Due to the car getting older (not us!) we decided to fly this year and luckily for us the trains were running all the way through to the city with nary a bus in sight. Caught the Sky bus to the airport and booked in our bags, had a bit of trouble so a nice lady did mine. Once in Canberra plenty of taxis and ours earned himself more in the fare than the tip as he took the very long way round to our hotel. We dumped our bags and then set out to visit the festival to get our armbands. The tram went so far and then we hiked it. The Canberrians appear to have no footpaths just cycle paths. Still as no cycle passed us we were not bothered. Thankfully we both had hats as it was very warm and sunny. Dinner out with Ray and Joan, Ray and Jennie and John and Maree at a Dickson Thai restaurant which was very pleasant.

**Thursday:** We bought ourselves a tram card and then we were set for the tram each day (Stephen lost his tram card later that afternoon!) We went to the folk conference which as usual was very interesting. It always surprises me that not more people attend. Bruce Watson did a paper (talk) on his Great x 3 grandfather and Fanny Cochrane Smith, Heather Clarke did one on her 'Dancing in Fetters' brilliant exhibition, Erica Nielsen Okamura gave a talk on Miss Grace McMillan – A leader in education for kindergarten as well as higher levels. This was very interesting as one of the many courses Miss McMillan attended was one in Sweden to learn songs, dances and games for the kindergarten and primary ages. Sadly, by agreeing to go out to dinner with more folk friends, we missed the start of the Welcome Dance and therefore missed the Gay Charmers part of it as they started the dance off. This year the NFF committee were doing something a mite different to other years. The Welcome Dance was divided up into 4 sections each of 40 minutes duration (in the paper program only 3 bands were mentioned, not 4) . That turned out to be the best of the 3 bands (didn't know about the 4<sup>th</sup> act until the next day!) The second band was more a display rather than a join in dance. The 3<sup>rd</sup> band was done more as a workshop than a dance. Disappointed we left for the hotel. Thereby missing the last band which luckily I got to dance with later on.

**Friday:** Early start as wanted to catch the Trips & Triple Treats English Country Dance Workshop 9am. Which was very good. After that as a virgin to a proper music session we attended the 'How to Session' and found it very informative and was able to play along as well, probably because none of the tunes were frantic! Watched 'Queer the Set' display with Tolka (band). Music was brilliant and the dancing was well done, it was Irish set dancing with 8 people all dressed up to be either men or women but were not necessarily men or women? While Stephen went to play in the session bar I toddled back to the Coorong (where all the main dances were being held) and enjoyed the dances from the Scottish dance workshop and the Square dance dance. Very pleased we didn't miss the actual dance as it was a lot of fun (not many square dance moves that I was expecting) nevertheless a really fun experience. I finished up at the Scottish Ball (more of a Ceili really to the disappointment of true Scottish dancers). However, as I don't do a lot of Scottish I enjoyed it.

Everyone had lots of fun. Watched the Indian dance as I had a cuppa. Took part in the Old Time dance workshop and was therefore all prepared for the Old Time Ball with the Gay Charmers. Mainly couples dances with a couple of circle ones. Only one dance I didn't know and that was the Foxtrot. Maree Buttler said she knew it so we got up and had a go. Pity it was the Monte Carlo dance as we were out first time!

**Monday:** Doesn't a weekend fly when you are having fun! Again spent the day in the Coorong. Stephen was a judge in the Traditional Social Dance of Victoria dance competition and I had a go at the dances. Always nice to try new dances out and feel good when even the hard ones are a success. The winning experienced dancers dance was one I enjoyed very much and was pleased that it had won but I must admit the square dance grid one was fun to do, tricky but so pleased when it worked. Keith Wood won this section again! Congratulations Keith - it was an enjoyable dance. ## ANOTHER ARTICLE FROM VFMC ARCHIVES

Below is an article from a 1971 'Tradition' that Ray Mundy has found to share with us all. Thanks, Ray.

### FIRST FUNCTION FOR THE NEW COMMITTEE

To start off our first One-Day Festival we are holding a reception Come-All-Ye on the Friday night at the Boree Log for all Festival Ticket holders. If you haven't got one by then, you will be able to buy them at the door.

On Saturday morning, the programme starts with a workshop by Peter Parkhill on "The Songs and Styles of British Traditional Singers."

Peter has sung in folk clubs in Britain and Europe and since his return, has become popular for his powerful singing style, particularly of ballads. Because of his wide knowledge of British Traditional Music, his workshops at the Monaro and Aquarius Festivals in Canberra were a great success. We expect this workshop will be up to his usual high standard.

After lunch Jim Buchanan will lead a session on Australian Folk Music with a lot of audience participation. He is well known for his interest in little known and unusual Australian material, and as a performer for his banjo picking and his merry lagophony. His jovial wit and walrus moustache disguise a deep knowledge of the Australian Tradition.

Following a short break, Paul Tarrant will present a workshop on American Music. Paul too, is no stranger as a performer, particularly country blues, but also has a wide interest in other forms. He first began playing with Marg Smith and Dave Howells and since gained a great deal of experience performing with the late Graham Sqaunce, Glen Foster and Ken White. His workshop at the Adelaide Festival with Ken White was one of the most popular and best presented, so we anticipate this one to be no exception.

To wind up the day, there will be an informal dance at Royal Park Hall featuring COMHALTAS CEOLTOIRE EIREANN CEICIDH BAND assisted by the Victorian Folk Music Club Dance Band to provide music for Irish and Australian Traditional Dances. For those who will be unfamiliar with these dance forms, experienced dancers will demonstrate. This lively night will be a fitting end to what we hope will have been a most successful day for all concerned.
