CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW—AUGUST 2024

SPOT ACTS:

Rudy started the Concert off with the Spot acts, singing Join Denver's song Calypso. This was inspired by Denver's visit to Jacque Coustou's vessel of that name. Rudy has played in bush bands over the years and did a medley for the Galopede dance.





Tony and Cathy from the Peninsula Folk Club chose two lovely songs: Mary Black's Katie. and the Dougie MacLean song Caledonia. Both were accompanied by their expertly played guitars.

Margaret Creighton has for many years contributed to the gross national happiness index through running both successful community choirs and ukulele groups, and tonight she brought along her uke group to perform. Constantinople from the music hall era is always popular with the uke players. They then did a parody of These Boots Are Made For Walking - 'One of these days I'll play my uke with someone else, not you'. So there!



SUPPORT ACT:

We had a Support Act this night with Club member Ed Robins performing a number of his own, sometimes quirky, at other times insightful, songs. Harrisville's Annual Young Farmers' Ball was a bit of both, maybe the start of a country romance abruptly coming to an end when a spider appeared on Doreen's dress, set against the monotony and routine of a small farming town. Then a hypothetical question - what if Gog and Magog (in the Royal Arcade) actually come to life after dark when



everyone has gone home? A natural question I suppose from any youngster's secret fears. Dance With Me is about thoughts of things in nature that dance.

Ed's dad was at one time a country vicar and had plenty of memoirs to fill his biography, including when the appointed hour for the burial of Henry, a local, unfortunately coincided with a heavy rainstorm which threatened to fill the grave. A Grave Situation has the answer of course, if you have any choice in the matter choose a site up the hill a bit. Watercolours On The Wall; a story of Dougie The Decorator Crab, and Fly To Freedom is a quirky story of the consequences of a bird stuck in the chimney. Thanks Ed, some clever songs.

CONCERT NIGHT REVIEW (CONTINUED)

MAIN ACT was Green Fieldz, Keith Rea and Sally Carter, who create a storm of high end energy with blazing fiddle, lively guitar work and melodic ukulele. Soaring vocal harmonies add to their unique sound which blends the many musical genres they play into a journey of fun. Based on the Mornington Peninsula, the duo have wowed the crowds at many festivals across the country. The Irish and Celtic Music Festival in Yass, the Celtic



Festival in Beechworth, the Girgarre Moosic Muster, and many others including the Yarra Junction Fiddler's Convention, They have just returned from a 4-String Festival in Kawhia in NZ, Two of Sally's tunes started their act, Spring Of Pegasus with some very sweet tinkling and expert fingerpicking on guitar and uke, and included a very nice love song which introduced Keith's richly resonant guitar. They are just as proficient at Irish reels like Drowse Maggie and foot-tapping Music For A Found Harmonium. David Wilcox's Black Dog is an imaginary conversation between a neighbourhood dog and a child, again with rich guitar, and Bill O'Malley's Barn Dance. Tune In G with guitar and fiddle projected really



well. Then a NZ love song by Kenneth Ward, a gentle pensive song backed by Sally's tinkling ukulele which included a little bit of Maori culture. The jazz classic Tico Tico followed, expertly played on their instruments. These guys are great vocalists, with a fabulous range of songs, but are also superb instrumentalists, on their rich and tuneful guitar and uke. No guitar thrashing here, each note clearly audible, and without a PA.

The Bluegrass tunes Salt Creek and Sweet Liza Jane are two foot-tapping tunes very well played with every note clearly audible. Then a medley of The Shamrock Shore with Forgiven Not Forgotten.

Sally writes tune books and they did another of her lovely little tuneful pieces with well-done harmonics added. Her song Daisy Chain retains a child's wonderment and started with more neat harmonics on the uke. I have to say these two are the most impressively skilled pair of musicians I have seen for a long time. They put on a superb program of masterful guitar and ukulele work. Their repertoire is wide, covering all genres, meticulously performed, including a bit of old ragtime and The Can Can believe it or not. A lively medley of train tunes closed their act. What a fabulous night of top talent!

Next month September we have the traditional A Cappella night and have lined up three local community choirs. It will be a busy night so please arrive early. Thanks to all who contributed to bringing this night's concert to life.

I am ashamed to say that when I first joined the VFMC I had never heard of Wattle Day, but when asked to participate in the Club's annual celebration of Wattle Day, I felt inspired to do a little research into this day. The result was the song below, which will be performed (as it is annually) at our Wattle Day bush dance, which this year is on Saturday 7th September (see pages 10-11).

WATTLE DAY

In the early 1900's the Wattle movement was begun, When acacia pycnantha glowing golden like the sun Was included on an Aussie stamp and our brand new coat of arms, As a flowering symbol, green and gold, for our cities and our farms.

But not till 1988 was the golden wattle named As our national floral emblem and officially proclaimed, And then after that in '92 the first day of September Was established as our Wattle Day – a day we must remember.
