


Lighting – too much backlight



Lighting – Reduced backlight

Lighting setup





- Light in front of you, not behind
- Watch your own picture on the Zoom screen to see what others will see

Signing in



- If you already have a Zoom account, edit your profile to show your correct name (see Appendix for details)
- If you haven't signed up to Zoom, please do it now so that you can show your name when you join a meeting.
- Alternatively, use 'Rename' in the Participants sidebar (details later in this presentation)
- Why is this necessary so the meeting host and other participants can recognise you when you join a meeting
- So far, we have had no security breaches, but we want to keep it that way!


Internet



- If possible DO use LAN cable, not WiFi.
- DON'T run anything else on the same network while using Zoom. If your kids are watching Netflix, it won't be a great experience for either of you.
- Zoom chews up data! DON'T use prepaid accounts if you don't want any nasty billing surprises.

Use a LAN cable

Is there a LAN socket on your modem?





Is there a LAN socket on your computer? Desktops will have one, bigger laptops should have one.

LAN cable



- Very thin laptops may require a USB-LAN adapter
- Officeworks or JB HiFi or Jaycar will have them.



Camera options



Built-in

External webcam (USB)

Mobile phone *

Audio options



- Built-in mic
- Built-in mic on external webcam
- USB mic **
- USB audio interface *

* Separate mics, pickups etc plugged in like a studio or live mixer

Somewhat better



** Bill's USB mic is a Thronmax MDRILL from Jaycar Electronics. Rode and AKG make good USB mics. Note that you may not be able to get a USB mic to work on an iPad, iPhone or Android tablet or phone.


Using the toolbar






Audio and Video settings






Audio settings

Optimise your audio



- Only available with Windows and Apple desktops
- Not available on Android devices
- Not available on iPad or iPhone? (not sure)

Background:

- Zoom is optimised for meetings, not music sessions
- Zoom tries to isolate voices, and tries to suppress any background noise (including instrumental accompaniment)
- So, we need to turn off the suppression to optimise for music

Steps to optimise audio



- In your Audio Settings:
 - Turn off automatic volume control
 - Reduce background noise suppression to 'Low'
 - You only have to do this once!
- In your main Zoom session window:
 - Turn on Original Sound
 - You have to do this at the start of every session!

Create a Zoom account and edit your profile


Create a Zoom account

- Edit your profile so that it shows your name.





Audio settings – First level





Audio settings – Advanced

Video	Show in-meeting option to "Enable Original Sound" from microphone

Audio settings – Original Sound



Every time you start a Zoom meeting, check that Original Sound is On. The control should be blue and show 'Turn off Original Sound'.

(you may need to move your mouse to make this appear)
